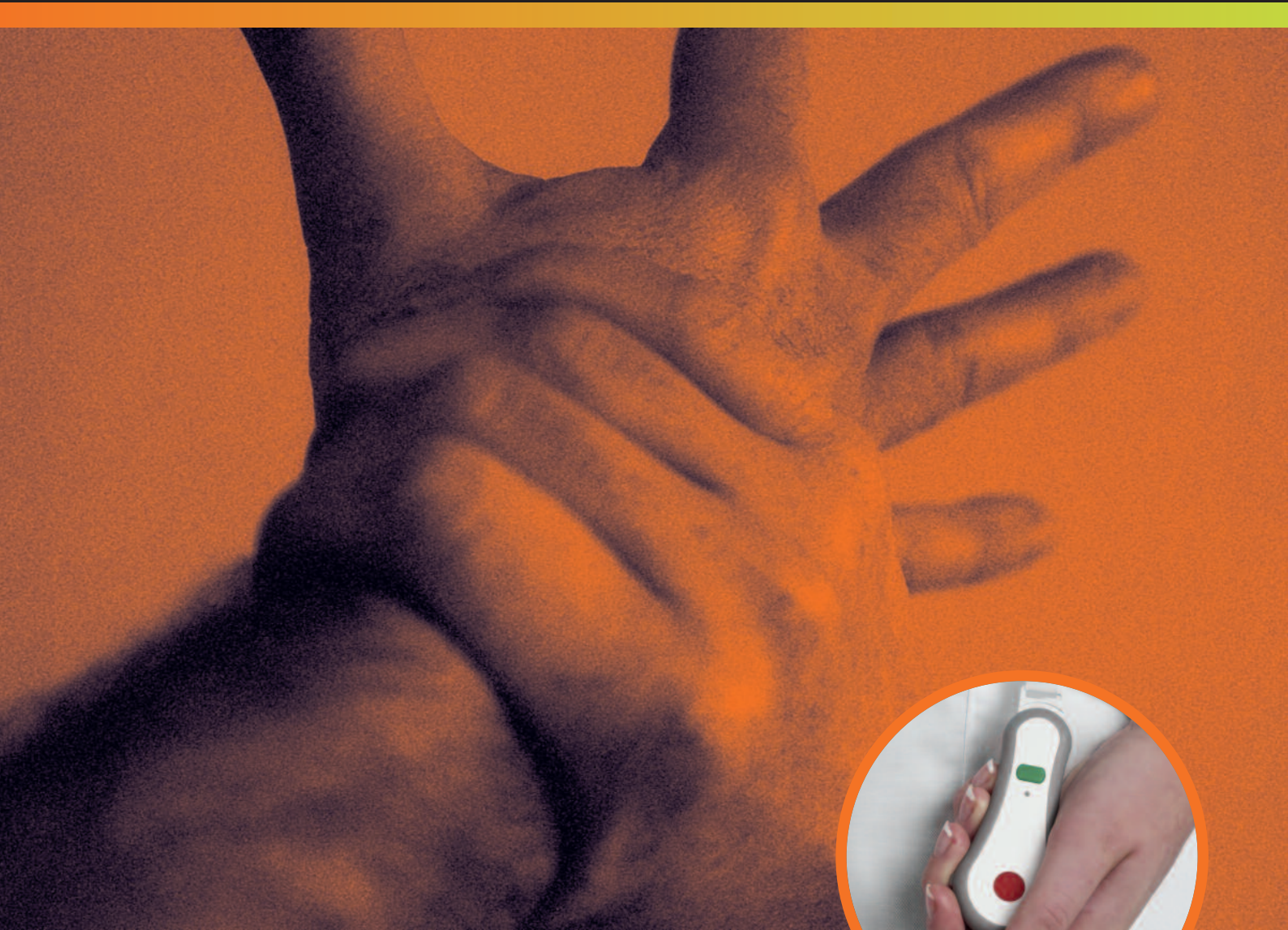

Our Red Alert system has been designed to provide a total solution for our clients whilst providing ease of installation and programming for the installation company.

The systems are designed to allow staff to summon assistance by activating an infrared transmitter. The alarm signal is picked up by a local infrared receiver and communicated back to LCD indicator panels and/or radio pagers that are situated in key positions throughout the building. A range of panic buttons is also available.

The starting point for a Red Alert System is the system control unit or Hub as we call it. This has the total capacity of 254 addressable alarm units and 26 LCD indicator panels. Multiple control units with interlinking equipment can be used to cater for larger sites.



Installation couldn't be simpler - addressable devices (infrared receivers, call points etc) are wired in a number of radials from the Hub in standard twisted pair cable, for more detailed information refer to our installation and programming guide.

Programming couldn't be easier either - a hand held programmer lets you configure each device whilst commissioning a system. A receiver name can also be changed when necessary.

Staff carry infrared alarm transmitters, containing many features that have been requested by our clients over the years. Our latest transmitters now have rechargeable batteries that last for up to 12 months, following a maximum 1½ hour charge time.

This system can be easily integrated with our range of Network II nurse call equipment. This integration is commonly used in establishments where both patient care and staff attack are a consideration, for example psychiatric hospitals. Disabled WC alarms, which are now mandatory, can also be easily integrated into our system.
